2017 District 6 TLI Education Sessions

Below are descriptions for the education sessions held between 9:00-11:45. **Note:** Role-specific officer training sessions are held 8:00-8:45 and are not covered in this document.

DCP - Lead versus Lag Measurement - Dave Pearson

Time & Location: 9:00-9:45 am, Conference Room C

Description: The Distinguished Club Program (DCP) is a critical part of Toastmasters. How do you, or your club, view the DCP? Is it a tool which helps your club begin the Toastmaster year with quality and excellence in mind, or does it simply serve as a warning sign as the year ends, to remind you what hasn't been achieved? Is your club reactive, or proactive? How do you, your club officers, and the club plan to achieve the goals of the DCP well before the finish line is crossed next June 30th, 2018?

This session will look at the Lead versus Lag metrics of the DCP and, with a few examples, help you understand what can (and should!) be done from the beginning of the year to help club members in general, and the club as a whole, experience a quality, educational, and enriching year as Toastmasters!

Advanced VP Education Training - Donna Emond

Using Body Language to Build Rapport - Sarah Bateman

It begins with their body language and the type of signals they use. The two main categories of signals are friend and foe. Discover the main types of friend and foe signals and how to use them affectively.
