What lessons did you learn from Toastmasters?	You do not have to be naturally good at leading or speaking to be a Toastmaster. You just have to possess the desire to improve yourself and to help

What key strengths would you bring to the role?	I have been in a management role for more than 12 years and have experience developing and leading diverse teams of people.
Why do you want to serve in this position?	I am on track to be a DTM by the middle of this calendar year and now it is time for me to give something back to this organization. I have developed and sharpened skills as a result of my time as a Toastmaster. It is my sincerest desire to help other Toastmaster's develop their skills and bring about that opportunity for them.
In your opinion, what are District 6's major objectives and how would you work to achieve them?	For recruitment, I would encourage everyone in the division to bring a friend or family member to a meeting with them whenever they have a speaking role to provide moral support. That will bring a steady stream of potential members into the meeting. Once there, they can decide if they want to be part of it or not.
	For educational achievement, I would like to see an incentive (like a certificate or a manual donated to the club or a division governor visit) for the first club in each area to complete a CC, a CL, and an advanced manual. That may give some clubs a push to make early progress towards Distinguished status.
	For recognition – I think the division and area governors need to personally congratulate Toastmasters and/or clubs after they post an educational award – by phone or e-mail. It only becomes a big deal if we take the effort to make it a big deal.
