Jane's DTM Story

I have multiple DTM's. My first one took about 6 years. My home club members, Speakers Under Pressure, worked hard in building my selfconfidence and helping me to realize that "Yes" I do have a voice. In order to complete my first DTM and others I needed to step out of my comfort zone and work outside of my home club. I asked My Area Governor at the time "Should I take on being an Area Governor?" His answer was "Yes.....you can do this!" Many many years later he said to me remember that statement.....here is the finish of it "You can do this? WHY? Because you can!" That statement resonates with me today. Every DTM I receive is just as exciting to receive as did the first one. I am who I am today because of Toastmasters. The challenge for me was to get out of my head in thinking that I have nothing to share with people.

The most rewarding part of working for the District is not just one but multiple rewards. First you meet so many other Toastmasters that help you along the way and want you to succeed. Second is you find yourself. You find yourself in ways that you could not have imagined before. For me that was to find exactly what I excel in. It could have been giving presentations.
