District Leadership Role

Have you been asked to serve in a district leadership role? And did that question make you squirm or made you uneasy? If it did, you are not alone. We have all been asked to serve in a district leadership role but our own hesitation and fear of failure are the top 2 reasons when we turn down such an offer.

I have often wondered, why do we usually say no? Is it fear of failure? Is it not knowing the role? Are we just too tired with our club roles?

Looking back, I have come to realize that we put our own limitations when asked to serve in these roles. It took me 3 years to finally say yes to Area Director. I still remember Mary Swanson, a district leader, was the first person to ask me to step into a leadership role. To me Toastmasters was all new and I came up with every reason to say no. Today I feel, that Mary saw something in me that I did not at that time. She saw I was ready to contribute based on her experience. If I ever had to change my mind, I would have said yes.

So next time when someone approaches you to serve in the leadership role, ask about the role. Ask what the requirements are and feel free to ask why you are being asked. Consider the benefits. As an Area Director, you fulfill a requirement for earning your DTM.

My Journey to DTM Marcia Belisle

My journey to Distinguished Toastmaster (DTM) has spanned over 18 years and I tell people that I am proud of that time. When I started with Toastmasters, I had no thoughts about achieving DTM and probably knew little about what that award even meant. I have been in a wonderful supportive home club, V.A.M.C. This is another great club. I also decided to go way outside the clubs last August and attended the International Convention in Chicago. The convention was another fantastic experience as I met people from all over the world.

Come this year, the final requirements for DTM were met thanks to a variety of people in both D6 and D106 who I met along the way. Now I enjoy mentoring other members and I am excited to be working on my first Pathway. Who knows where that will lead!

Rebuilding of Goal Getters Harold Osmundson


As clubs often struggle with membership, here's a story of what's possible for every club:

Important TMOY Dates


- **June 1**: Club selects a TMOY and forwards to Area Director.
