We had an awesome annual conference on May 3 & 4 at Crown Plaza Aire in Bloomington, MN.

Pres Vasilev, 2013 World Champion of Public speaking was the featured guest at the conference. The district team worked with him to schedule his visit and worked on other logistics to cover his travel & stay. Pres Vasilev entertained, educated and inspired the conference attendees with 3 sessions during the conference.

In his first session on Friday titled "Uncover the glory of your story", Pres shared the 7 storytelling tips of making a speech effective. He gave his speech titled "Hope" that took won him a spot in the finals of World Championship of Public Speaking. The audience analyzed the speech based on the seven secrets of storytelling. We also learned how to make a speech effective.

On Saturday, Pres gave a keynote tilted "Journey to World Champion of Public Speaking" In this session Pres wowed the audience by sharing his experience of preparing for the International Speech competition that took him all the way to finals. A tough journey that was fully dependent on the message, preparations, feedback and perseverance. His speeches were presented to the audience so that they can experience what was important when preparing an important speech.

Pres's third presentation was a workshop titled "Secrets of compelling storytelling". In this workshop, the audience crafted stories, discussed the techniques of improving them and revisited the earlier versions to improve them. We also heard his winning speech "Changed by a tire." We analyzed the compelling nature of the storytelling of this speech. Pres shared what portions were refined based on feedback that was received at Toastmasters clubs all over his district.

Pres is an awesome presenter and those of us who use storytelling to enhance our speeches surely learned a lot from him. We hope to have another opportunity to have Pres visit District 6 in future. Here is a link to his winning speech.

Eden Prairie Resident is Quarter-Finalist in World's Largest Speech Contest

Kenny Ray Morgan rose above a pool of 150 Toastmaster participants

St. Paul, MN, May 16, 2019 – Kenny Ray Morgan of Eden Prairie, MN outshined more than 6 local participants to win the district-level competition of the Toastmasters International Speech Contest

representing southern Minnesota. Morgan has now qualified to advance to the quarter-final rounds of the contest.

Each district winner competes at the regional level. The winner is judged based on the video of the contest recorded at the District level. Fourteen winners from regions around the world advanced to the semifinal round after a six month process of elimination through club, area, district and regional speech competitions. The five-seven minute speeches were judged on content, organization, gestures and style.

Morgan has made it to the finals (top 10) in 2011 and 2013. He is owner/founder of Morgan's Custom Clothiers in Eden Prairie, MN. Kenny Ray has been a dedicated Toastmaster member for the past 13 years.
