George Deliduka, DTM Celebrates 58 Years in Toastmasters!

In June, 1962, as a "new" 2nd Lieutenant at my first operational assignment in the U.S. Air Force in Charleston AFB, SC, I went to a family-owned "Walgreen's Type" store to purchase a newly designed baby bottle product from Playtex. It was for the first child we were happily expecting. The owner, Clarence "Pop" Poppleton, had never heard of it. He

went to his office, and came back shortly, saying he had ordered the product and it would be available in a week. He then said he wanted to take me to dinner as a thank you. I said that was not necessary, but he insisted. One week later, he drove me to the Charleston AFB Officers Club.

How could a 65-year-old civilian take me to the Military Officers Club? Why I didn't ask to this day, I don't know. He escorted me into a meeting room where 15 men were gathering for dinner. My initial exposure to Toastmasters. At the end of the meeting I was asked to comment on what I saw and heard. In my head I thought that I might not make the Air Force a career, and that I would follow in my mother's footsteps and become a teacher. I asked to join for six months and see if it was "really" for me. My official membership started July 8, 1962. The rest is history.

I will never forget my Ice Breaker Speech. I approached the lectern, put my speech on it, and began to speak. When it was over, I returned to my seat. Later my evaluator, Paul Pow, stood up and smiled at me. He said "George, do you know who you are?" I answered, "Yes, I think so." He responded, "Then why did you read every word?" So began my career in Toastmasters.

Within my 20 years in the Air Force, I maintained active membership in Clubs from Agana, Guam; Maguire AFB, NJ; Langley AFB, VA; and Eglin AFB, FL. While in Thailand from 1970-1971, I attempted to charter a club at Ubon, RTAFB, but was not successful before I left.

When I got settled on the Gulf Coast of Florida, I joined a Saturday morning club, Playground Toastmasters. That was June, 1971. July, 1972, I was appointed Area 5 Governor. July, 1973, I was "encouraged" to accept the position of District 29 Governor, as no one else wanted to take on that role. That turned out to be momentous! At the International Convention in Houston, TX, I carried the club votes of 19 Clubs to the Business Meeting where the resolution to accept women to the organization was presented and passed.

That was the same year that I achieved my first Distinguished Toastmaster designation. There were so few awards that each one had a registration number. It was 142 [July, 1973]. My second DTM was awarded September, 1973 [434], and third DTM in December, 1974 [2174].

I retired from the Air Force on May 31, 1980, and chose to come to Minnesota. I still do not know why my credentials were not accepted by the past leaders. They told me I had to "earn" my recognition.

I was accepted as an Area Governor in Metro Division in 1983. Back in the early to mid-1980's there were many people vying for District leadership positions. I ran for Metro Division for three years, being elected in 1986. I then ran for Administrative Lt. Governor for three years, elected in 1989. The succession ended in July, 1991, when I was elected District 6 Governor. My additional leadership roles in District 6 include: Credentials Chair, Toastmasters International Pathways Ambassador, and currently, Club Historian.

I achieved Distinguished Toastmaster for the fourth time in June, 1998 [6858]. My communication achievements include completing every Legacy Manual ever published. With my Pathways speech projects, I am now approaching 500 unique speeches. Today I am pursuing my fifth DTM under the Pathways Program. I have begun my 59th year eager to learn more, and stay engaged as best I can.

Editor: George, after all these years, what keeps you motivated?

George: The evolving changes in the Toastmasters program. Each time I began the journey, I went back to an Ice Breaker Speech. The Legacy Manual requirements changed, meaning I was not repeating speech projects. Also, the Leadership requirements changed, adding a new challenge. The fourth DTM followed the requirements that just ended this past Toastmasters year. This fifth journey is in Pathways, and it has new challenges.

Secondly, it would be my helping others. I have tried hard not to espouse my ideas and beliefs to the detriment of others, as I have made my presence, and desire to mentor. I believe my greatest success was assisting the growth of a mentee, Patrice Pariseau, who went from a place of insecurity to being a Presidents Distinguished Northern Division Governor. Seeing others grow is tremendously satisfying.
