District 6 members have been working hard in Pathways. In 5 months, you have earned 319 educational awards and 26 triple crowns. Way to go!

I want to encourage all of you to continue to sign up and progress through Pathways. The Pathways program is amazing! The Pathways adoption rate (rate for those who have chosen a path in Pathways) for District 6 is as follows:

Members 80%

New Members 48% (new members that have joined in the last 6 months)

Club Officers 89%

Note: new members should be 100%. If you are a new member who has not picked a path in Pathways please ask your club officers or mentor to assist you if you need help. Through Pathways you will learn to be a better speaker and a better leader. I guarantee it! Skills learned in Pathway projects carry over to your job and family.

Empower yourself to be the best club officer you can be by participating in Club officer training. In the breakout sessions come prepared to share your challenges and what is going well so we can learn from each other. Don't forget: If your club had all seven club officers attend training in round 1 and has all seven club officers trained in round 2, your club will receive a Magnificent 7 ribbon for your banner.



Paying Forward – Paying Back

When editor Cathi said this article should contain approximately 425 words, the smart-aleck in me considered reaching that total by saying "Thank you" followed by the names of ~200 fellow Toastmasters! The point, which would have been lost on you had I gone that direction (!), is that your service to our members, especially when you serve beyond your home club, has been my inspiration to be of service throughout my 13+ year Toastmasters journey, including for events outside our clubs, like speech contests, education events, and visits to other clubs.

Speech contests

The contest Toastmaster–my favorite contest role! – dutifully states the standard TI verbiage about the benefits of contests. There are <u>many</u> more benefits than those stated in that script. Contest volunteers learn from each other, build their Toastmasters network which they can leverage for future events, and increase the visibility of their home clubs. Feel free to ask me about not only the Toastmaster role but any contest role: chief judge, judge, timer, ballot counter, sergeant at arms. I've done all of them except the newest role of Zoom moderating!

Education events

I'll admit that checking that club officer training box is often the prime motivator for attendance! However, I've found many additional benefits in serving with fellow Toastmasters to produce successful officer training sessions, TLIs – Toastmasters Leadership Institutes, and District conference education sessions. As trainers, as officer breakout session leaders, or as session conveners (I've had the fun of each!), we learn from each other, build our Toastmasters network to leverage for future events, and increase the visibility of our home clubs.

Visiting other clubs

This way to meet service-oriented leaders is obviously part of District officer roles, especially that of Area Director. I enjoyed those visits during my Area Director stint, but have made sure to continue visits outside

that role. These interactions have been valuable opportunities to learn from each other, grow our Toastmasters networks to leverage for future events, and increase the visibility of our home clubs (and not just when a potential EGG capture is involved! — See picture below). Both in our environment of online meetings (no geographic limitations to visiting!) and in our future return to in-person meetings, I'll keep up those visits and encourage others to do the same. No worries if you decline the hosts' invitations to become a member of their club. (True story: I've been rightly scolded for NOT asking that of a visitor from another club!) You and they may not become members of each other's club. There is, however, a great chance that you and they will become new partners in service, whether at the kinds of events I have described, or in other valuable ways.
