


Top 5 reasons to attend a Toastmasters Leadership Institute or Club Officer Training:

1. Network and share best practices

- 2. Help your club earn a point in the Distinguished Club Program (DCP)
- 3. Revisit goals and determine the best use of your time for the rest of your term
- 4. At TLIs, learn how to become a better evaluator
- 5. Share and develop your talents while serving others through assisting with training

This year, we are trying something new. Instead of having a district-wide TLI in February, each division will be hosting one (or more!) "mini-TLIs" that will include, at a minimum, a club officer training session and a session on enhancing evaluations. The TLIs are your best growth opportunity, and you may attend *any* TLI, not just the one in your division. Each



division will also host at least a couple of "make-up" club officer training sessions, if you can't make the TLI.

Enjoy the Holidays and Gain Members

Although the holiday season is a busy time, it's still possible to have fun and gain members in December. Below are three ideas to enjoy the holidays with your club:



Holiday Party - Designate a December meeting as a holiday party and potluck. Encourage each member to bring a food or drink item, guests, and white-elephant gifts. The Table Topics session can use those gifts as topics. That is, each audience member selects a gift, unwraps it, and then speaks on it. Food and fun for everyone.

New Year's Toasting Party - When the New Year

approaches, designate a meeting to celebrate the new year and practice toasting. Each audience member can give a short toast, and these count as speeches in the <u>Special Occasions manual</u>. Bring plastic glasses and plenty of ginger ale to practice with!

Goal-Setting Meeting and Workshop - Wouldn't it be great to have a meeting with speeches and topics focusing on goal setting for 2016? This promotes your club and adds educational value to members and guests.

December is also the time to plan an open house in January. Reach out and help growth-minded individuals achieve their goals in 2016 by inviting them to your club.



Before You Cancel That Meeting, Please Read This!

When work and life are busy, and/or attendance is lower, it's tempting to cancel regularly scheduled meetings. I know the feeling. However, canceling meetings hurts the club and its members in several ways:

- A club can't help its members grow unless it holds meetings. Each meeting is an opportunity to grow by giving a speech, giving feedback, participating in Table Topics, or other participation. When a meeting is canceled, then no member benefits, and the club doesn't achieve its purpose.
- Canceled meetings send a negative message to members, implying that their
 presence isn't enough to justify a meeting, or that a certain number of members
 are needed. Meetings with just two members can still be beneficial, and this
 article explains how.
- A club can't grow without meetings. Guests need to attend a meeting before they'll join. By canceling a meeting, neither the club nor its members can possibly grow.

It's reasonable to cancel meetings that fall on holidays, but please resist the temptation to cancel meetings for other reasons. Use each meeting as an opportunity for members to grow.
