Remember when you first joined Toastmasters, walking into your first meeting? Perhaps you were nervous. Maybe you looked around and thought everyone in the room was a better speaker than you. Perhaps you weren't sure you'd ever be able to stand in the front of the room. Maybe this describes you now.

The good news is the Toastmasters program works if we put the program to work for us. We know the amount of effort you put into the program determines how much you get out of the program. If we hold quality meetings, with engaged members, and great evaluations and feedback as outlined in the Toastmasters manuals, then this is the best way we support our existing members. Soon those members will achieve and progress at a rate they previously thought impossible.

It has been said, "With great power comes great responsibility", and this couldn't be truer with Toastmasters. We are inspired by hearing our fellow Toastmasters explain how much they benefitted from the program and decided to give back. Perhaps you are looking for a way to give back to the organization and help make this experience possible for more people.

How can we give back, you may ask...? Let's start close to home, in your club. By making a commitment to have a great club, you can greatly impact the Toastmasters experience that you and your members are exposed to. There are three membership contests throughout the Toastmaster year. Why not try to win all three awards? That would be an amazing accomplishment!

If you are looking for more ways to give back and grow your own leadership experience,

why not take part in starting a new Toastmasters club? There is no better way to gain a better understanding of how a club operates than to teach the fundamentals to a new club. By serving others to help them achieve their goals, you'll be greatly rewarded in the appreciation of new members and you'll greatly enhance your leadership character.
