"TOASTMASTERS, UNLEASH YOUR POTENTIAL"

This was the theme chosen by International President, Jack Gillespie. The District Six Theme became: "Together We Will Unleash Our Potential".

The leadership team first met in November, 1990 to map out the leadership philosophy and strategy for the year. The candidates running for Lt. Governor of Marketing, Dave Paxton and Bruce Trippet were asked to be involved. They were asked to study a philosophy of leadership and if they could gain a measure of understanding and acceptance see if they could foster that philosophy for at least three years.

The philosophy that was fostered was "self-directed leadership". Instead of "top - down" control, the impetus for action would be generated by the Toastmasters themselves through their Area Councils. More latitude and decision-making authority was given to each Division Governor. They were, in effect, to run "miniature districts".

Area Governors were encouraged and trained to develop involved Area Councils, instilling in Club officers the necessity of being accountable to their members to allow each Toastmaster to achieve their potential.

The most important word was "ACCOUNTABILITY". Members were to be accountable to Club Officers to state their needs and desires. The Officers were to be accountable for insuring that those needs were met. Area Governors, Division Governors, and the rest of the District Leadership Team were accountable to everyone to foster the results oriented action necessary to achieve personal success.

New ground was "tilled". New ideas were experimented with. Some "old" ideas were reconsidered and implemented. There were many success stories.

The first "new" event was the Fall Conference. It was held in a business conference center, Cragun's in Brainerd. There were many different things that were offered; Friday Night Fun Night which included a Bar-B-Que Buffet, and a Sunday Morning Brunch. Well over 100 people attended the weekend, and positive comments are still being heard at District Events. Mary Andrist won the District Six Humorous Speech Contest

The second "new" event was the implementation of an entire Public Relations program. Jim Miller was appointed District Public Relations Officer, and was given "carte blanche" privileges to promote Toastmasters activities throughout the District. The results were astounding.

1. A new billboard was designed, completed and displayed. The Toastmasters of District Six voluntarily donated resources to cover the billboard's construction expenses.

2. An informational videotape was orchestrated by Beverly Burchette. That tape was offered to other Districts throughout Toastmasters International. It has been aired frequently on cable stations throughout Minnesota and Canada.
3. Jeffrey Connors helped in getting Toastmasters Week and Toastmasters Month Resolutions declared by Mayors and the Governor.
4. The Toastmasters Blitz Week was a huge success again.
5. The Toastmasters Telephone was busier than ever with inquiries as public awareness was increased through the Billboard and the marketing activities of the Toastmasters of District Six.

The third "new" idea was a risk-taking adventure. When Toastmaster Clubs made the decision to disband, their charters were offered to men and women who were interested in fostering Toastmasters but may not have had the resources to Charter a new Club. There were seven such success stories"

1. N.W.C.C. Toastmasters started with Speechcraft and accepted the Charter from Center Speakers, the Judging Specialty Club.
2. Beach Masters accepted the Charter from Control Masters, sales people from Honeywell, Controls Division.
3. Best of the West started with Speechcraft and accepted the Charter from Gas Toasters, of Minnegasco.
4. Heart of the Harbour, Thunder Bay, started with Speechcraft and accepted the Charter from Park Avenue.
5. River Valley of Winona, accepted the Charter from the Mayo After Hours Club of Rochester.
6. Toastmasters in Rochester wanted to start an Advanced Speakers Club, named Southeast MN Advanced Speakers, and accepted the Charter from Slice of Life.
7. Toastmasters in Duluth wanted to start an Advanced Speakers Club, and have accepted the Charter from Lake Superior, Two Harbors.

The Spring Conference was held at the Holiday Inn International, Bloomington. It was a HUGE success. A record attendance for the Speech Contest was recorded. Another "first" was instituted at this Conference. There was a Candidate's Forum. Toastmasters running for elective office who had opposition, were given a chance to introduce themselves, and then were available to answer questions from the audience. This format was similar to the Presidential Debates. This first Forum was moderated by Past International Director Ian Edwards. Again, positive comments far outweighed any potential negative comments or perceptions.

The Communication and Leadership Award was presented to Ms. Patty Wetterling, founder of Jacob's Hope. A forum that speaks about child abduction and child protection issues throughout the U.S.

The Region IV Conference was held in Sioux Falls, SD. on June 4-6, 1992. It was a wonderful event. The largest contingent of Toastmasters from Region IV came from District Six. We had contestants in the Second Annual Lip Sync Contest, The Humorous Speech Contest and The International Speech Contest. Beverly Burchette and Kathy Droz impersonated the Judds. Jeff Haebig presented a speech on winning. Mary Andrist was Second Place Winner with her speech on Deer Hunting.

"FOCUSING ON QUALITY..."

The year began with excitement, enthusiasm and a set of new goals to reach. The 1992/93 International President was Bennie Bough, DIM. His theme was "DYNAMIC CLUBS DELIVER...". Governor Koering chose a theme that related back to the basic needs of the member. She wanted quality in our club educational programs and in our club leadership. That is how the District 6 theme "FOCUSING ON QUALITY..." evolved.

The theme was also incorporated in our newsletter with the name changing from the District 6 Digest to the "District 6 FOCUS". Four issues were published with Sarah Germain and Jon Shields as editors.

A "QUALITY" pin was awarded to any Toastmaster completing two or more educational programs within the calendar year.

The district leadership of area governors and division governors were trained and ready to assume their responsibilities officially on July 1st. The top four officers traveled to Canada on August 1st to meet and train our Canada leaders and share in a picnic.

Two awards were accepted at the International Convention in Las Vegas. First Place in the Humorous Speech Contest was Dallas Sursely from Positively Outspoken #3998 with his speech titled "Humble Pie". Kris Hanson from Mankato #175 was recognized as "Toastmaster of the Year" from January-June 1992.

The senior district officers attended the Region IV Midwinter workshop with seven other districts on January 23-24th at the Sheraton Inn in Bloomington. International Directors Doug Couto and Richard Peterson led the session.

The 15th Annual Parliamentary Procedure Workshop was held at Prudential on February 13, 1993. Tom Schmid organized the session.

Sue, Bruce, and Joy visited the Rochester prison Gavel Club #96 (Round Table) on Sunday, February 28, 1993 and participated in the program.

The Spring Conference was held at the Marriott Hotel in Bloomington on April 23 & 24th. International Director Doug Couto made his official visit. Governor Sue Koering was recognized on WCCO Radio with the "Good Neighbor Award" for her contributions to Toastmasters and the community.

The western style Fun Night included the 3rd Annual Lip Sync Contest. First Place went to Wendy Cain, Keith Elliott, and John Villemonte from AC Earlyrisers #3646 with their song "The Speaking in Public Blues". Second Place went to Todd Post from Sunrisers #2140 with his song titled "Let's Blow Up The Tow Truck".

The Awards Breakfast included recognition for the best newsletters. It was later noted at the conference that this was the worst year in 17 years for membership worldwide with a 1.1% drop overall.

"People Building People"

District 6 accepted International President Neil Wilkinson's theme, "**People Building People**", as its own as it increased its membership and clubs in anticipation of his spring Presidential Visit.

Toastmasters University, the educational and training umbrella of the District, was renamed **Toastmasters Education and Leadership Institute (TELI)**. Under the superb leadership of Frank Mayers, DTM, it continued to plan and coordinate the bi-monthly educational and officer training sessions at the Holiday Inn, Bloomington, along with the two Contest Judging Workshops. TELI highlights were the September "Resource Fair" emceed by Judy Rider; the November "Speechcraft"; the January "District Officer-Only Humorous Speech Contest" won by Howard Cox, Area 3 Governor (Toro ProsE #5369); and the March "Leadership Resource Fair" with past International Director Terry Daily, DTM, as the featured speaker.

The **District Governor's Golden Gavel Award** was created to be given by District Officers to any Toastmaster who displayed communication and leadership excellence. Over 1,000 Golden Gavel lapel pins were given to deserving individuals. Special District Governor's Golden Gavel plaques were given to Jon Shields ("outstanding publications"), Susan Navratil ("outstanding leadership"), Erv Schroeder ("5-time Area Governor"), Frank Mayers (TELI founder and President), Pat Kirk ("outstanding Area Governor trainer"), Tom Oelberg ("outstanding leadership"), Shirley Daniel ("club building"), MY-T Speakers Club #6446 ("outstanding Area Speech Contests"), Hudson Hooters Club #7443 ("outstanding club growth"), Sally Muraski ("excellent conferences"), Dick Peterson ("outstanding Presidential visit), Allen Bernard ("outstanding leadership"), Mary Ann Morris ("outstanding leadership"), Stan Dickinson ("40 years of District leadership"), and Harvey Mackay ("in recognition of his outstanding worldwide publicity of Toastmasters International").

Past District Governor **Bob and Rita Pierce** each received a District Governor's Golden Gavel plaque to thank them for their decades of service to the District. They retired this year and moved to Tucson, Arizona. They will be missed. Past District Governor **Doug and Char Ward** also left the District as they were transferred to Rockvale, Tennessee. They gave many years of service and friendship to the District.

October was **Toastmasters Month** celebrated across the District. Highlights included:

In Thunder Bay, International Division Governor Yves Prevost coordinated a special Toastmasters Day with two Area Contests and a special luncheon where the Mayor made a special proclamation for Toastmasters. District Governor Bruce and Bekka Trippet were honored guests. The event was featured on the local television news that evening.

In downtown Minneapolis, Metro Division Governor Pam Doan and Marnie Peterson coordinated a full two-hour speech-a-thon in the City Centre Mall. Toastmasters gave speeches to the passing shoppers and a representative from the office of Minnesota Governor Arne Carlson gave District Governor Bruce Trippet the official proclamation declaring it Toastmasters Month in Minnesota. Miss Minnesota, Julie Richardson, a Toastmaster, and Patty Wetterling, 1993 Communication & Leadership Award recipient, both were featured speakers. Harvey Mackay, local businessman and international best selling author and speaker, sponsored the event.

In downtown St. Paul, Eastern Division Governor Keith Hardy coordinated clubs to set up booths in the skyways and in businesses to publicize Toastmasters. The mayor made an official proclamation.

Many other clubs across the District held open houses and got their local mayors (e.g. Hutchinson, Rochester) to recognize Toastmasters in their towns.

The many "space aliens" evident during the Friday Fun Night were inspired and entertained Toastmasters the following day. After a full day of educational workshops and club membership awards, the evening Humorous Speech Contest was won by Dan Field (Viking #591) representing Eastern Division. Visiting District 19 (Iowa) Governor R.W. Smith, DTM, humored us with his educational seminar, while International Director Ron Giedd, DTM and his wife Julie, DTM, attended as special dignitaries. Ron visited many companies in the Twin Cities and St. Cloud, was interviewed on St. Cloud radio, and delivered an educational seminar and keynote address. Sally Muraski (though injured and in a wheelchair during the conference) and her conference committee did a wonderful job steering the District Six starship to a great Fall Conference!

The Sandstone Correctional Facility gave the District special recognition at an Awards Banquet for all the support given the Paramount Club #657 over the years. Past District Governor Ken Nelson has coordinated this support for many years.

The second annual District "Christmas with Joy" party was held at Joy Pirkl's home in Coon Rapids. All district officers and leaders attending were in festive spirits with much singing and gift giving (and taking!) Santa (played by Carol Berkowitz' - Anoka #2748 - daughter, Becky) even made a special visit.

The top four District officers hosted and attended the annual **Region IV Mid-Winter Workshop** with their peers from the seven other districts at the Sheraton Inn in Bloomington. International Directors Doug Couto and Ron Giedd conducted the leadership training.

The **16th Annual Parliamentary Procedure Workshop** was held at the Prudential Company on February 5th under the leadership of Tom Schmid and his committee of parliamentary experts. **Beatrice Metzler, Area 32 Governor** flew down from Thunder Bay for the day to attend. Lt. Governor Marketing Jim Miller chauffeured her to and from the airport in appreciation of her long-distance dedication!

Travel across the District was usually made in the official "**District Van**" of Lt. Governor Education and Training Joy Pirkl. Complete with coolers of fruit and pop, mobile phone and boxes of educational materials, thousands of miles were traveled to Canada and other places outside of the Twin Cities.

Bruce, Joy, Jim, and Keith made a special visit to the **Twin Ports Club #5850** at the Duluth Twin Ports Correctional Facility in February to train their officers and attended an excellent meeting. This club was the **top club** in the District and finished 10th in the world this year!

Two billboards were placed around the Twin Cities proclaiming "**For the Fear Love of Public Speaking -- Join Toastmasters!**" Hundreds of people have called the Toastmasters hotline after seeing the phone number on the billboard.

The highlight of the year was the **visit by International President Neil Wilkinson, DTM, and his wife Jean, DTM**, for the Spring Conference. President Wilkinson received a warm welcome at his first stop in Thunder Bay. He visited two companies, met with the mayor, local press, and many Toastmasters, during his half day visit. Next, was a visit to IBM, Rochester, where Neil and Jean attended a demo meeting before being honored at a reception that evening by the mayor of Rochester. The next day Neil visited five companies and was interviewed on WCCO TV. Jean toured the Twin Cities and spoke at a taping of the "Good Company" television show.

Friday night, Neil and Jean hosted a special reception for the district leaders, then dined with the Past District Governors Club members and their spouses before being featured in a Wizard of Oz lip sync act with the District officers during the Friday Fun Night festivities.

The Saturday opening ceremonies included a videotaped message from Harvey Mackay, arranged by Marnie Peterson (ToaStars #9605), welcoming everyone to the conference. Harvey acknowledged President Wilkinson as a "winner" and donated 300 copies of his best-selling book, "Sharkproof", to present to the first 300 conference attendees.

Educational seminars were delivered by Neil, Dr. Harry Russell and Past District 19 (Iowa) Governor and nationally known humorist Joan Johanson, DTM. Neil made remarks at the annual meeting of the 25 Year Club, met with the new leaders at the Area Governors' Reception, and delivered his keynote address, "People Building People," that evening before the largest Toastmaster group ever gathered at a International Speech Contest banquet. The contest was won by Eric Hokanson (Duluth #1523) representing the International Division. The Communication and Leadership Award was presented to KARE television news anchor Diana Pierce at the noon luncheon. Also announced were the best club bulletin awards: Best Overall and Best Graphics Bulletin - All American Speakers #4686 (The Toaster); Best New Bulletin - Talk of the Hut #9624 (Talk of the Hut); and Best Non-Computer - Cambridge Communicators #7964 (The Communicator). The Lip Sync Contest was won Friday night by Carol Myers (Positively Outspoken #3998). The Don Murray Award was given to Violet Schmitz (Centennial #3580) for her work behind the scenes across the District. Special recognition was given to Sally Muraski and her committee for coordinating the largest Spring Conference ever, and to Dick Peterson and his committee for coordinating the Presidential Visit. A special thanks went to Mary Ann and Lou Novak for coordinating the activities of Jean Wilkinson during her stay.

The **Region IV Conference** was held June 16-18 in Fargo, North Dakota. Eric Hokanson, Dan Field, and Carol Myers represented the District in the three contests. Terry Daily presented an educational session at the conference. The same weekend the Rochester Club #271 celebrated its 50th year anniversary.
